Thursday the 9th of May is Ascension Day, and the sad thing is that this day will come and go, and many Christians will not even be aware of it.

The Ascension marks the culmination of Jesus' earthly ministry, the moment when He returned to the Father in heaven. This departure, though sorrowful for His disciples, heralded the fulfilment of God's divine plan for our redemption. Through His Ascension, Jesus asserted His authority over all creation, and is now seated at the right hand of God the Father.

Why is the Ascension crucial to our faith? There are a number of reasons. Firstly, it validates Christ's identity as the Son of God. His resurrection demonstrated His victory over sin and death, and His ascension confirms His divinity and eternal reign. In ascending to heaven, Jesus showed that He was not merely a great teacher or prophet but the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Secondly, the Ascension assures us of our future hope. Just as Jesus ascended into heaven, He promised to prepare a place for us and will one day return to gather His people to Himself. Our faith in the Ascension reminds us that this world is not our final home. We are citizens of heaven, as we eagerly await our reunion with our Saviour.


